- Ω staying over when Sheena's family goes away on holiday.

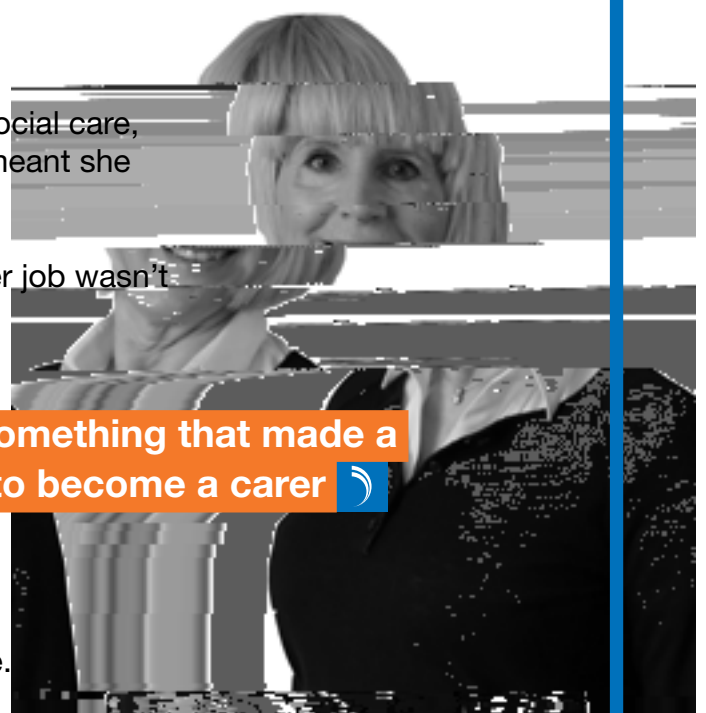
Getting into social care...
